Our next major event is the CMOR World of Trains Gala on Friday, December 1. We will be running trains, and also manning the bar and serving wine at the dinner.

We then have the KAMR Christmas party on the following Sunday, December 3.

I propose to decrease the number of work sessions in December, perhaps to just once a week, but that is subject to change. We will certainly met on Sunday, December 17 (the regular third Sunday meeting). I will ask Cliff to send out e-mails about the work session schedule.

We have had a productive month, with a fairly steady crew of 5 or 6 at most work sessions. The lower loop is working and had quite a few trains run through it during the Holiday in the Mountain festival. We fixed a problem with the turnout to the staging yard by replacing it and it now seems to be working well. We added a shoofly at the west end of the yard to connect the mainline there to the upper (mine) loop, put in the connecting curve between the Yard and the Lumber modules, and have the track work done connecting the yard to those main line tracks. The Yard has power, and with the completion of the connecting curve we achieved a major milestone of completing the main line track. We can now run a train from the lower loop, through the Harbor module, the Lumber modules, the Yard, and around the upper mine loop, and return. There are some rough spots yet, and the automatic reversing for the mine loop is not installed as of yet. Many thanks to everyone who has shown up and made that possible.

I have suggested that we have a 'Golden Spike' ceremony on Friday night during the Gala to celebrate the main line completion.

And since we can run on the main line, we again have the possibility of having an operating session on the third Sunday if we want to try that.
