The week of June 23rd is the National N-scale Convention and Train Show, this year in Louisville, Ky. The train show is open Friday afternoon for those registered for the meeting, but is open for everyone Saturday and Sunday the 28th and 29th. This year the show is combined with the traveling "World's Greatest Hobby" show which features most MR manufacturers as well as the usual independent dealers. Some of us attended the WGH show in Atlanta last year and can attest that it is big and about as good as the show following a National NMRA convention. The WGH show goes to only 4 - 5 cities around the country each year, so we are lucky to have it so close this year. Every scale will be featured, not just "N". There will also be a huge N-scale modular layout to see. The week of July 7th is our annual Model Railroad Summer Camp in the museum. We will have 12 - 15 kids ages 8 to 12.
