Here are the dates for August, 2009. Regular club Sunday meeting on the first Sunday, August 2. The third Sunday, August 16, will be an operating session, starting about 1:30. Saturday work sessions will be on August 8 and August 22, starting about 9:30. Thursday work sessions will be on August 6, 13, 20, and 27 starting at 9:30. We have a fifth Sunday in August, the 30, and that will be work Sunday.

We had a lot of people for the July operating session. Two man crews for most of the trains. It was a bit chaotic but fun. All of the trains were run although we still haven't run passenger trains. Curt and I are still operating on Tuesday AM. The attendance on Thursdays has been about average. Saturdays has been the hardcore attendees.

Work continues on the mountain in the corner, the rebuild of South Wyeth and the engine terminal. Track work in South Wyeth still has to be completed. I have a dual-gauge switch jig from Fast Tracks, and have used it to build 2 dual gauge switches for Lumberton, and we are installing those. I also built a standard gauge switch using a Fast Tracks jig which has now been installed in South Wyeth. We have been operating over that one, and have had no problems at all with it thus far.

We continue to work on operating problems as we encounter them. Achieving a reliable roster of locomotives is one area that needs work. Remember to bring locomotives and controllers for the operating session.

When you can, come and see what has been happening. Come and runs trains, or just hang around.

Our venture into DCC is continuing. Modifications to the peninsula reversing loop now works correctly. We still have some tweaks to wiring under the 'T' module but they should be minor. In the end, operations in and out of the peninsula under DCC power will be much easier. The only requirement will be to have the switches properly aligned.

We have been successful in reprogramming our n-scale fleet with unique address codes. These codes with ownership and engine details are being listed in our DCC logbook. This should help operators with engine identification that will avoid duplication of address codes on the layout at any given time.

Fellow n-scaler Charlie Womac was able to find time to escape from his busy new home life and bride to join us at our last gathering. He jumped right in on his ongoing construction of the lumber mill on the loop module.

Larry Burkholder brought in a DCC auto reversing module that we could use on the layout if necessary. At the time we were unsure if it was needed until after we rewired the current device on this section. The jury is still out until we complete the wiring changes for this section of the layout.
